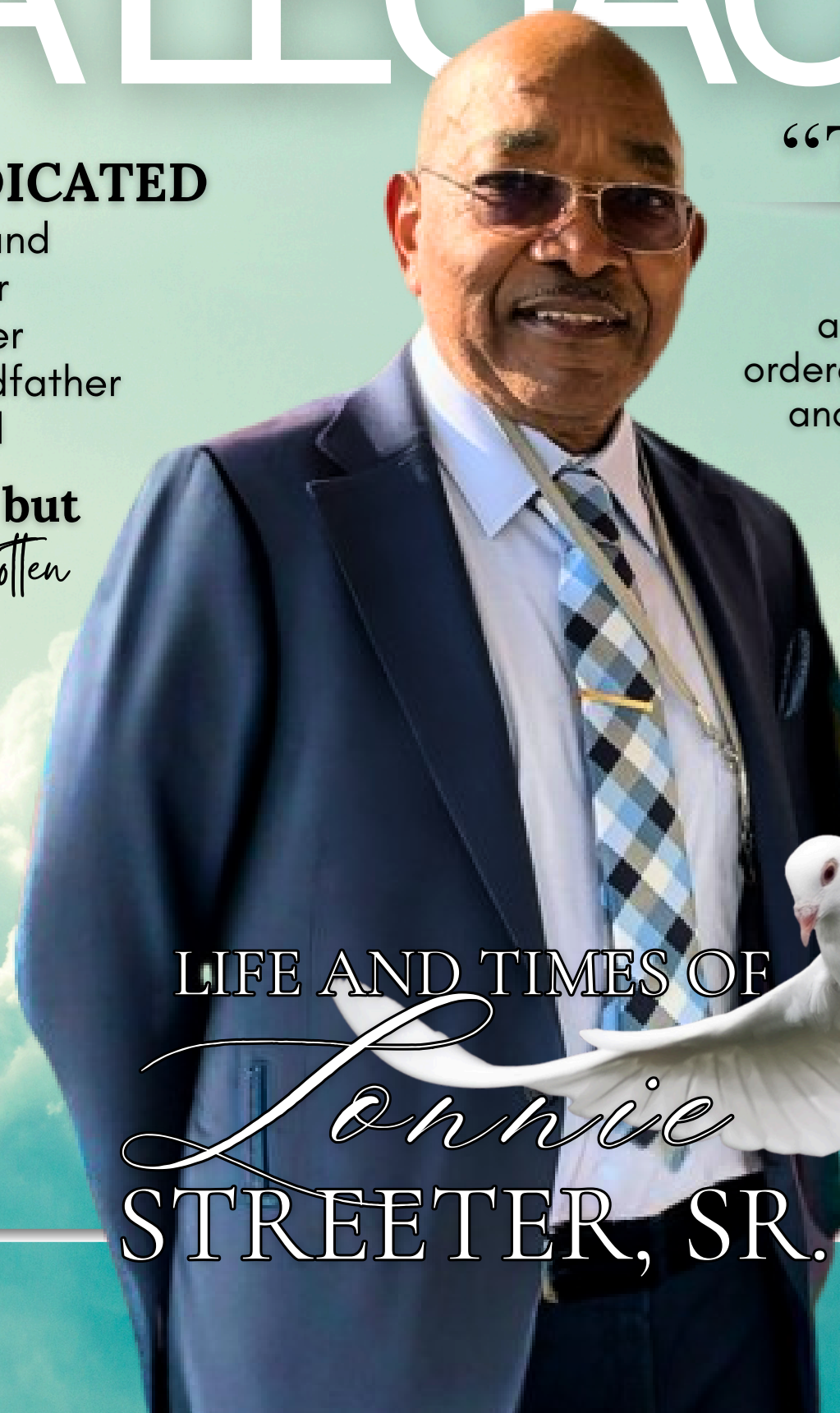

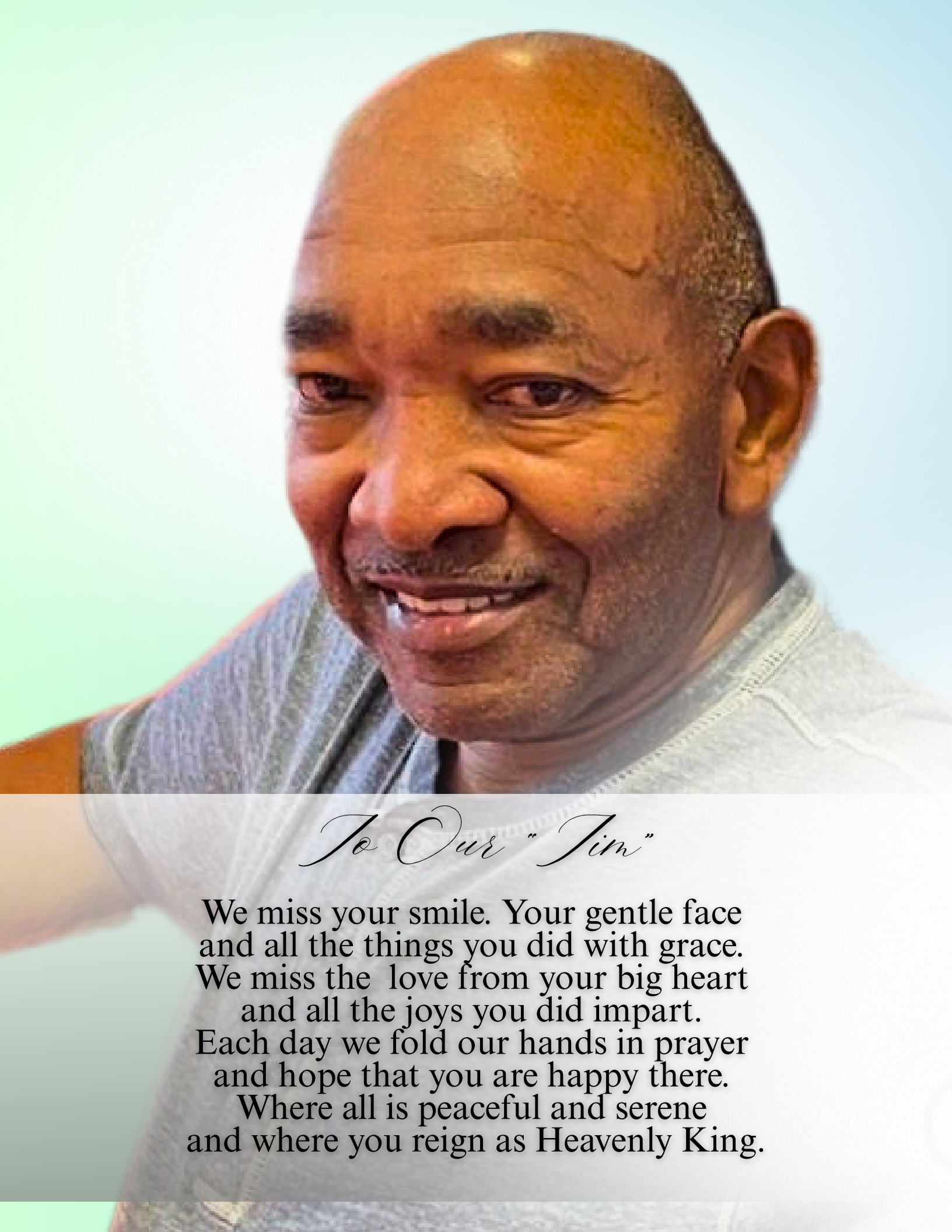

# Obituary

## MR. LONNIE “TIM” STREETER, SR.

1946 - 2025

Mr. Lonnie Streeter was born on October 11, 1946, in Sumter County, Georgia, to the late Mr. Joe Streeter and the late Mrs. Johnnie Mae Ross Streeter. He attended the public schools of Sumter County and later returned to complete his education, earning his GED.

At an early age, Mr. Streeter united with Lebanon Baptist Church and later transferred his membership to Americus Pentecostal Church, where he faithfully served until his health began to decline. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge until the late 1990s and proudly served his community as a volunteer firefighter with the City of Plains.

Mr. Streeter was a certified welder and electrician. He was employed with Metulax, now known as Cooper Lighting, for 38 years before retiring, later returning to work an additional three years. He was also the owner and operator of Streeter Construction.

On July 3, 1966, he was united in Holy Matrimony to Mrs. Mable Muff Streeter. Their loving union of 59 years was blessed with eight children. Affectionately known as “Tim” by family and friends, Mr. Streeter was a devoted husband, father, grandfather, and community servant.

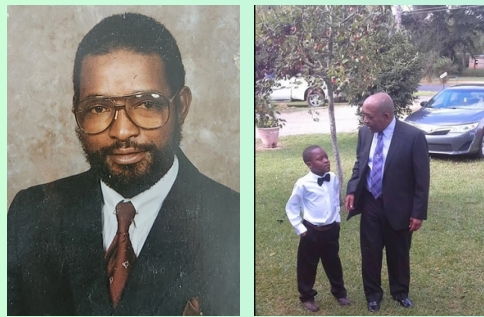
