

MR. DOCK HARRELL was born on January 14, 1938, in Abbeville, Wilcox County, Georgia, to the late Mr. Alex Harrell and the late Mrs. Nettie Jones Harrell. Dock's journey was one marked by love, resilience, and faith.

He was preceded in death by his devoted wife, Mrs. Minnie B. Harrell, whom he met by chance while she was working at a laundromat during his employment with West Palm Beach Sanitation.
