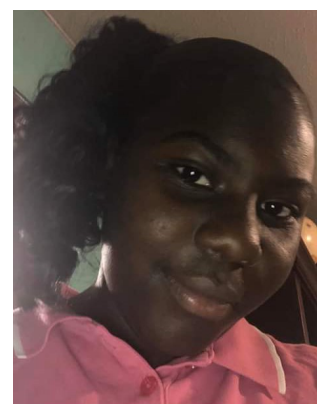
OBITUARY
