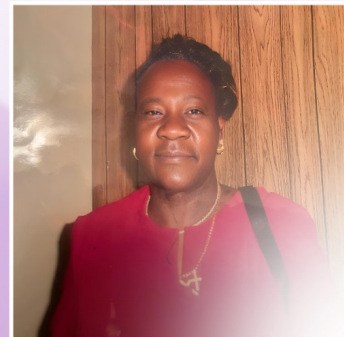
BERTHA MAE POSTELL
