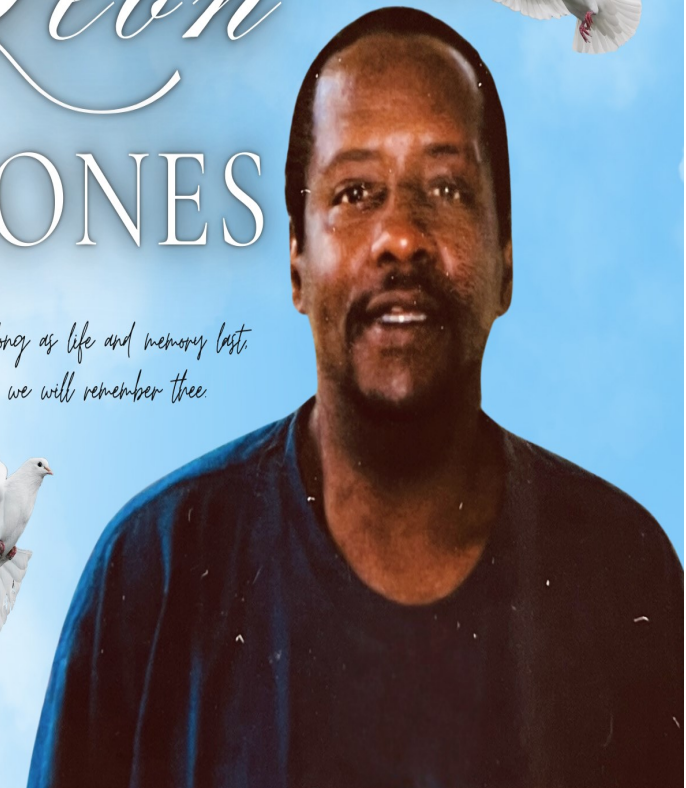

The Obituary

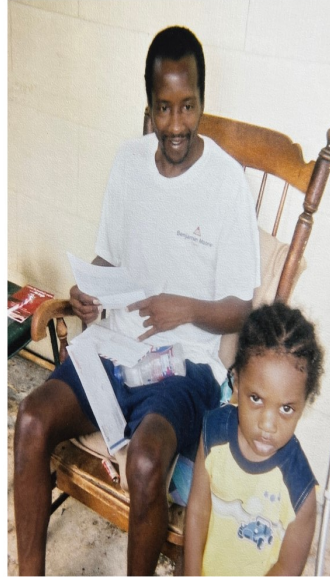
