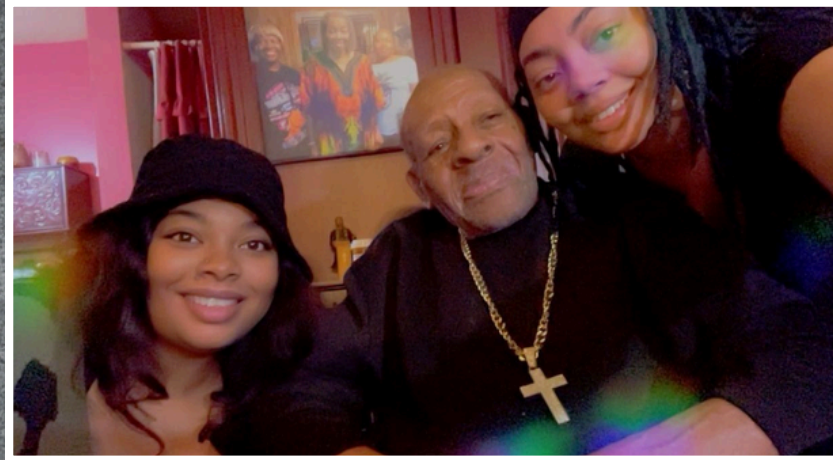
Obituary
