

VETERAN NEAT WESTON SMITH, JR. was born February 28, 1954, in Sumter County, Georgia to the parentage of the late Mr. Neet W. Smith, Sr. and Mrs. Vernette Smith who survives. He was the first of nine children. He received his education in the public schools of Americus, GA and graduated in June 1972 from Americus High School, at which time he was bestowed the title of Mr. AHS and served as Senior Class Secretary. He excelled in athletics and played quarterback and defensive end for the Americus High School Panthers football team.

After graduating from high school, Neat entered the United States Air Force and served his country from April 5, 1973 to November 1, 1982.
