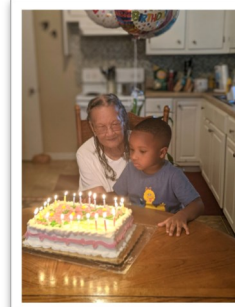
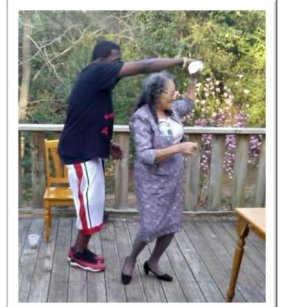

Mrs. Eula Mae Paschal Breedlove was born in Sumter County, Georgia on June 24, 1929, to the parentage of the late Mr. Bobby Paschal and the late Mrs. Florence Clark Paschal.
