

# Remembering Veteran WILLIS JEROME HOLLIS

## Obituary

VETERAN WILLIS JEROME HOLLIS was born on August 2, 1947, in Sumter County, Georgia to the parentage Mr. Robert Hollis and Mrs. Frankie Ball Hollis, who both precede him in death. He is also preceded in death by his grandparents: Ms. Ethel Seay Ball, Mr. Frank Ball, Ms. Bobbie Hollis, and Mr. Cleve Hollis.

Willis became a member of the Friendship Missionary Baptist Church as a child, where he remained a member until his health failed. Willis attended Sumter County Schools and was a graduate of the Sumter County High School class of 1966. He later attended Fort Valley State University until he was drafted into the United States Army and served in the Vietnam War with the 139th MP CO, Fort Jackson, SC, receiving the National Defense Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, and Vietnam Campaign Medal. Willis was trained as a sharpshooter expert and later, a central office switchboard operator. That training led to his prided career as a Booking and Central Officer with the Sumter County Sheriff's Office until he retired. Prior to retiring, Willis had a career as the store manager at local pharmacies, being blessed to transition once companies expanded and rebranded as other pharmacies, such as Super X, Rite Aid, and lastly, retiring from CVS.
