Why cry for a soul set free?


Miss me a little, but not too long, and with your head bowed low. Remember the love that we once shared. Miss me, but let me go.


For this is a journey that we all must take and each must go alone.

You are not forgotten, dear one nor will you ever be as long as life and memory last, we remember thee.








The Obituary
